In her work as a puppeteer and director, Sophie Bartels mainly deals with the strategies of object theatre. In doing so, she explores and further develops the means of this particular art form. One of her most important works as a performer is her solo *The Mermaid's Shoes*, which was created in collaboration with the French object theatre company Théâtre de Cuisine, and which she has performed in German and French. Another important work is the production sans papiers, a reflection on Walter Benjamin and Lisa Fittko's story of flight. She also co-directed *Bambi/Kaleidoskop*, a collaboration between students from the Ernst Busch Academy of Dramatic Arts in Berlin and the École Nationale Supérieure des Arts de la Marionnette in Charleville-Mézières.

Eva Costa is a Berlin-based author, director and voice actor. After her debut at the Venice Biennale, she performed internationally before focusing on immersive theatre installations exploring sound, space and sensory perception. Her work moves between art, science and everyday life, often in collaboration with diverse communities. Voice also plays a central role in her practice, which she explores through performance in multiple forms. Her projects are supported by institutions such as the Berliner Senate, Fonds DAKU, the Venice Biennale and Radio RAI. Her latest work, *La regina della neve – libro performatico*, reimagines Andersen's tale through the figure of Gerda as a symbol of resistance and change. The piece takes the form of a "performative book," a hybrid object combining listening, movement and tactile experience. Developed as a cycle, it unfolds in different formats, where the audience becomes the sole performer, navigating a changing, adaptive narrative space.

Emma Laule is a contemporary circus artist and creator based in Berlin. Her two main projects are her Compagnie Common Ground, a collective of 6 high-level multidisciplinary circus artists, currently creating their second show (premiering in September 25) and on the other hand the project Laule & De Miguel, a collaboration with a dancer and their show *Permeable Bodies* in which a mobile made of ganite stones becomes alive while exploring object-human relations. Moreover she is also active in the feminist circus initiative (IFC) in Germany and in the Zeit für Zirkus Festival, the German counterpart to La Nuit du Cirque.

Ada Mukhína (born 1988 in St. Petersburg / lives in Berlin) is a nomadic artist, theatre director, author, and performer. After graduation from law school, she earned two Master's degrees in experimental theatre from St. Petersburg Theatre Academy and London's Royal Central School of Speech and Drama. She creates political, investigative, and participatory theatre performances across genres and borders that often invite the audience to step in. Her works, such as *Risk Lab, How to Sell Yourself to the West, Exile Promenade*, have been presented at the Berliner Festspiele, the Deutsches Theater, and the Sophiensaele in Berlin; at the Camden People's Theatre in London; Meyerhold Theatre Centre in Moscow; Frascati in Amsterdam; and Toplocentrala in Sofia. She was awarded a Berlin Fellowship from the Academy of Arts, a Global Exchange Stipend in South Africa from the Federal State of Berlin, and the Institut français × Cité internationale des arts residency in Paris.
